Lower Transportation Costs:

Supporting cycling can reduce the demand for employee parking, saving on space and maintenance costs. In addition to this, it reduces transportation costs, which in turn drastically reduces household costs.

For example, choosing cycling over an automobile for transportation can reduce the cost from \$0.67/km to \$0.24/km. GoByBike BC saved BC households over \$3 million in transportation costs by encouraging cycling.

Increased Productivity:

Employees who cycle to work often arrive energized and focused, leading to improved performance.

Better Retention and Recruitment:

Offering bike-friendly perks can make your workplace more attractive to new hires and help keep your current team engaged.

Reduced Absenteeism:



Secure & Visible Bike Parking

Safe, convenient bike parking is the cornerstone of a bike-friendly business. Consider:

- Visibility: Place racks or storage areas in well-lit, highly visible locations to deter theft and make them easy to find.
- Security: Provide options for locking both the frame and wheels, such as sturdy racks, lockers, or covered storage.
- Capacity: Ensure you have enough spaces for employees, customers, and visitors during peak hours.

Tip: Even a small increase in bike parking can make your business much more welcoming to cyclists.





Here is how you can help riders find their way to your business quickly and easily:



- Include directional signage on your website, social media, or listings to highlight entrances, amenities, and bike-friendly features.
- Consider using bike route maps or digital directions if you are located in a larger commercial or industrial area.





💔 On-Site Amenities

Providing amenities makes cycling practical and enjoyable:

- Repair tools & air pumps: Even a small repair station can help riders stay on the road.
- Water refill stations: Keep cyclists hydrated and reduce single-use plastic waste.
- Showers & changing facilities: Especially helpful for staff or commuters who ride longer distances.
- Lockers or gear storage: Secure storage for helmets, bags, and cycling equipment improves convenience.



💔 Staff Engagement

% Provincial Funding Opportunities

Businesses in British Columbia can access a range of funding programs to support bike-friendly initiatives. The province provides dedicated Active Transportation Grants which cover up to 70% of project costs for infrastructure such as bike racks, end-of-trip facilities, and improved cycling access.



Infrastructure Support & Tax Incentives

Installing cycling infrastructure such as racks and lockers, is not only supported through grants but can also qualify as a business expense deduction under federal and provincial tax rules. Some municipalities have bylaws that allow development cost offsets when businesses include high-quality cycling infrastructure in new buildings or renovations.

Businesses may also benefit from utility rebates and climate action incentives for improving accessibility and reducing vehicle trips. Partnering with GoByBike BC ensures you are aware of the full suite of available supports and incentives, and positions your business as part of a coordinated, province-wide movement to make cycling safer and more accessible.






W Membership Programs



% Eligibility & Requirements

Bike Friendly BC recognizes businesses that actively support and encourage cycling for employees, customers, and the community. To be eligible for recognition and listing in the Bike Friendly BC directory, your business must:

- 1. Operate in British Columbia.
- 2. Provide at least one bike-friendly feature for employees and/or customers (e.g., secure bike parking, repair tools, water refill station, change facilities, or discounts for cyclists).
- 3. Commit to maintaining these features in good working order.
- 4. Agree to be listed publicly in the Bike Friendly BC online directory.
- 5. Support the GoByBike vision to make cycling a safe, enjoyable, and accessible choice for everyday trips.

Step 1: Review the eligibility criteria. Make sure your business meets the requirements outlined above. Use the

Checklists for Bike-Friendly Readiness in Resources & Next Steps.

Step 2: Complete the online

application form.

Provide your business details, contact information, and a description of your bike-friendly features. You'll also be asked to upload photos and agree

to the program terms.

Step 3: Submit your application. Once submitted, you'll have the option to receive a confirmation email

with a copy of your responses.

Step 4: Application review. The GoByBike BC team will review your submission to ensure it meets

program standards. If we have any questions, we'll contact you for

clarification.

Step 5: Approval and listing When approved, your business will be added to the public Bike Friendly BC

directory and you will receive a digital badge you can display on your

website, social media, and physical location.

Step 6: Stay connected.

We'll keep you updated on cycling initiatives, GoByBike Week events, and

promotional opportunities to spotlight your business.





Your presence in the Bike Friendly Business BC directory starts with a free basic listing — giving your business visibility as part of a province-wide movement to support cycling.

For businesses that want to take it further, the GoByBike BC Membership program (launching this Fall) unlocks enhanced features such as photos, detailed descriptions, and promotional opportunities. These upgrades help showcase why your business is a great stop for cyclists and make your listing stand out in the directory.

Add High-Quality Photos

- Include clear, well-lit images of your bike parking, amenities, and storefront.
- Show your location in action customers arriving by bike, staff using facilities, or GoByBike Week celebrations.

💔 Write an Engaging Description

- Highlight your bike-friendly features up front.
- Share your story why your business supports cycling and how it fits your values.
- Mention any special promotions for cyclists.

Stay Active in the GoByBike Network

- Participate in GoByBike Week to connect with the province-wide cycling community.
- Share your listing on your own social channels with the hashtag #BikeFriendlyBC.
- Collaborate with other recognized businesses for cross-promotion.





% Why Active Transportation Matters in BC

Cycling and other forms of active transportation — like walking, scootering, and e-biking — have a profound impact not only on individual health but also on the wider community. Bike-friendly businesses play an important role in supporting this movement.

Active transportation contributes to a healthier, more sustainable, and connected province:

- Health benefits: Regular cycling reduces the risk of chronic disease by up to 30% and supports mental wellbeing, saving billions in health care costs.
- Environmental benefits: Transportation is BC's largest source of emissions (41%). Replacing short car trips with bike trips cuts trip-based emissions by up to 75%.
- Affordability: Driving costs Canadians about \$0.67 per km (~\$8,000-\$12,000 annually), while cycling costs closer to \$0.24 per km. That's a major savings for both employees and customers.
- Traffic reduction: With two-thirds of trips under 5 km, shifting even a fraction to active modes reduces congestion, improves safety, and creates more livable streets.

By supporting active transportation, your business becomes part of a larger solution to improve public health, environmental sustainability, and affordability in BC communities.





When businesses, organizations, and municipalities prioritize cycling infrastructure, the benefits extend beyond individual riders:

- Local economic growth: Cyclists are more likely to stop at multiple local businesses, increasing foot traffic and sales.
- Community vibrancy: Safe, accessible cycling routes create inviting public spaces and foster social interaction
- Inspiration for others: A visible commitment to bike-friendly amenities encourages other businesses and residents to follow suit, amplifying the impact.
- Emission reduction & cost savings: By making cycling a practical choice, communities reduce vehicle emissions, lower transportation costs, and contribute to a cleaner environment.

Even small changes like providing secure bike parking or repair stations help generate a ripple effect that strengthens the overall cycling culture and reduces reliance on cars.

Checklist for Bike-Friendly Readiness





To be listed in the Bike Friendly BC directory, your business must:
Operate in British Columbia.
Provide at least one bike-friendly feature for employees and/or customers, such as:
 Secure bike parking or racks Access to repair tools or a pump Water refill station Change/shower facilities Discounts or perks for customers arriving by bike
Tip: Even one simple feature, like a basic bike pump by the door, can make a big difference for riders!
Commit to maintaining your bike-friendly features in good working order.
Agree to be publicly listed in the Bike Friendly BC online directory.
Support the GoByBike vision: cycling as a safe, enjoyable, and accessible choice for everyday trips.
Gather Your Business Details
Business name & primary contact info (email & phone number).
Physical address (to be pinned on the map).
A short description of your bike-friendly amenities.
Logo & photos (optional now, but required if upgrading to a Member Listing this Fall).
Links to your website & social media (optional now, but required for Member Listing).



Checklist for Bike-Friendly Readiness





- Complete the online application form.
- Upload your details, including the selection of which category & sub-category you would like to be listed in. You will also have optional tags you can add to make searching the directory a breeze.
- Tip: Pick the category that best matches how cyclists interact with your business for example, a yoga studio would fit under Services, while a university campus would go under Educational Institutions.

If you have questions at any stage of the process, the GoByBike BC team is here to help - just reach out to us!



Once your application is submitted, the GoByBike BC team will review it to ensure it meets program standards. Approved businesses will be added to the Bike Friendly BC directory and will receive a digital badge to proudly share online and on-site. You'll also be kept in the loop about GoByBike Week campaigns, cycling initiatives, and future opportunities to spotlight your business.

Coming Fall 2025, you'll have the option to upgrade to a Member Listing for even greater visibility, featured placement, and added promotional benefits.

With this checklist completed, your business is fully prepared to apply — and to shine as part of BC's growing Bike Friendly network!
